IMPLEMENTATION

At Frodsham CE, we follow a diverse art scheme which enables learners to express themselves creatively, within a range of genres and artists. Through art, children will develop both their subject knowledge and practical skills and will benefit from opportunities to:

- Use different tools and equipment to create and manipulate artwork
- Use their imagination to explore materials and techniques
- Develop and refine fine motor skills through use of a range of tools
- Manipulate different media to achieve particular effects in their own artwork
- Analyse, interpret and evaluate their own work and the work of others, including famous artists
- Develop social interaction and teamwork skills
- Connect and collaborate with peers
- Express themselves, control emotions, and apply mindfulness techniques
- Help each other, and promote kindness
- Develop confidence in exploring new techniques to express their work
- Learn new skills, broken into manageable steps

The place of art within a broad and balanced curriculum cannot be overstated. Art education fosters a wide range of transferable skills which can support children's academic achievement. Opportunities to be creative enhance well-being and selfesteem and allow learners a safe space in which to express their feelings and emotions.
